

Physical Education:

PE lessons will take place on Tuesdays and Fridays. Mr Stoddart or Mrs Clifton will teach the Tuesday afternoon slot and your child's class teacher will teach the Friday session. All children must keep their PE kit in school. Full PE kit consists of: white T-shirt/polo shirt, black shorts/joggers/leggings, and trainers or pumps. Please make sure your child has outdoor kit available and earrings have been taken out.

Homework

Each half term, a 'menu' style homework sheet will be stuck in your child's homework book containing 6-8 homework tasks. Please select **one** to complete per week. Please return your homework book each week by **Wednesday** at the latest, so your child's teacher can mark their book ready to be sent home again on **Friday**.

Reading & Phonics

Phonics sessions are taught daily across KS1 using our Little Wandle Letters and Sounds

Any children who need additional support with this are given targeted intervention sessions to help them keep up. We also teach class reading sessions which focus on comprehension. We aim to expand children's inference, prediction and retrieval skills as well as developing their understanding of vocabulary. You can help this at home by reading with your child daily & asking your child questions about what they have read. We will listen to your child read in school during reading group sessions and provide them with a reading book matched to their phonics level. Each half term, we will carry out a 1-1 reading assessment with your child to determine if they are ready to move to the next book band. We will keep you informed of this progress.

Maths:

Children in Y1 will learn to count in 2s, 5s and 10s which will feed into multiplication and division. You can practise this at home by counting out loud with your child in 2s, 5s and 10s. Next the Y1 children will learn fractions, beginning with finding halves and quarters of shapes, objects and amounts. Children will also learn to identify 2D and 3D shapes. In Year 2, children will be looking at 2D and 3D shapes. They will also be looking at measuring height/weight and capacity. We will also be consolidating our learning from earlier on in the year.



English Novel Study:

Our English lessons are taught through the stimulus of a high-quality, carefully-selected novel study text. We are really

excited to introduce our summer term text 'George's Marvellous Medicine' by the much-loved author, Roald Dahl. We can't wait to share this brilliant and hilarious story with the children. This book will provide a learning hook for some super writing in our English lessons. We will also share and discuss other famous Roald Dahl texts with the children so they can compare his work.



Science:

In science, we will be learning about Space. Y1 children will learn about the Solar System, looking at the shapes and sizes of the planets and the order of the planets from the sun. We will also learn facts about planets, about space missions and famous astronauts. In Y2, children will be exploring the solar system, the sun and investigating how the sun affects our seasons. We will also be learning about why we have day and night.

Jigsaw (PSHE):

We will start the term with 'Relationships', learning about different types of relationships such as family, classmates, friends and ourselves. In Summer 2, we will move on to 'Changing Me' where we learn about how we change, grow and develop. In this unit we will learn to correctly name body parts and learn the differences between boys and girls body parts.



Religion, Ethics and Philosophy:

This term we will be focussing on different places of worship and asking philosophical questions, such as What does God look like? and What is love?. We will also focus on significant people in our lives and what makes people inspiring. We will find out who is important to us and why.

History and Geography:

This term, we will be learning about the coast. We will be visiting Scarborough in June to help support our history and geography learning. The main aims of the visit are to explore the features of the seaside environment that will feed into our map work lessons, and learn new geographical vocabulary like pier, coast, shoreline etc. Children will also be
