Maths

Y5- Maths will be continuing to build our confidence and fluency with arithmetic, particularly focusing on calculations which include decimals and percentages. In addition, we are covering position and direction, looking at co-ordinates, translation and reflection and shape before moving on to converting measurements. In Maths, we will also be completing some work on a project called Money Matters. We'll be covering many of our maths objectives through this and will develop the children's knowledge of financial literacy.

English

This term, English in UKS2 will look a bit different! Rather than following a novel study approach as we do in Autumn and Spring, we will instead be exploring lots of different stimuli to engage us with our writing. We will begin the term with a focus on narrative writing. Firstly, writing a short story to build suspense and tension based on the picture book 'The Mysteries of Harris Burdick', and then exploring descriptive skills in a narrative based on 'The Lighthouse' video. Following this, we will then be moving onto securing our non-fiction skills, showing off all of our history knowledge in an information text all about the industrial revolution.

History

In history this term, our topic is 'protests'. This encompasses lots of important protests in history which have contributed to shaping our future. This includes learning about protests about war in history, the suffragettes, protests on race equality in 20th century America and The Black Lives Matter movement, as well as learning about key figures including Nelson Mandela and Emmeline Pankhurst.

Geography

In geography this term we will be learning about India and where it is located in the world. We will identify some physical and human features of this country and discuss the positive and negative effects of these. Finally, we will compare similarities and differences between India and the U.K.

Art

This term, we will be exploring a range of Indian motifs and patterns through printmaking and clay. We will be creating a repeating block print using our own design and use the work of Kritika Somi to inspire our own pieces of clay work.
