Girls Football

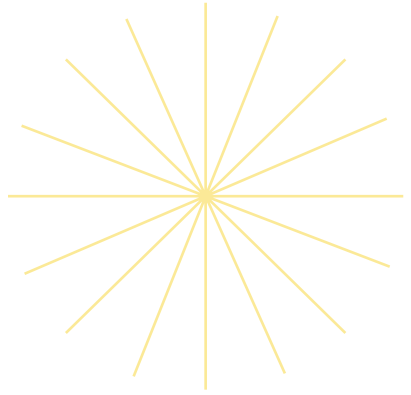
Over 465,000 girls to take part in our Biggest Ever Football Session on Friday 8 March.

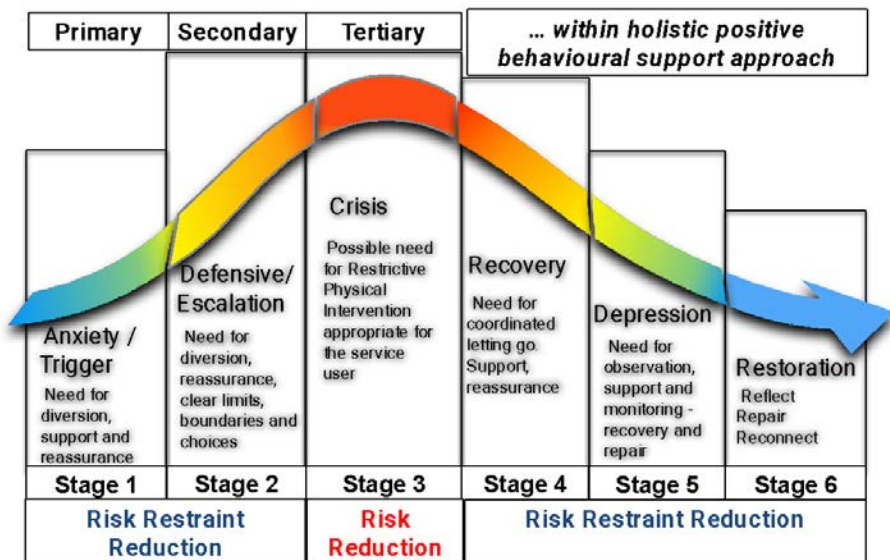

Loose lips never sink ships at Aston Hall. It's a safe space for grown ups to come and sound off, seek support or just have a coffee and cake. See you there!

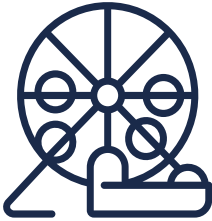


Mr Moakes our SEND Governor joined us for coffee and cake, with a few loose lips to chat with, and bring families together.

SATS – SPRING 2

PRACTICE SATS

If your child is in Y6 in 2024, read on for the most up-to-date SATs information for parents.

At the end of Year 6, children in England sit tests in:

- Reading
- Maths
- Grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS)

These tests are both set and marked externally, and the results are used to measure the school's performance (for example, through reporting to Ofsted and published league tables). Your child's marks will be used in conjunction with teacher assessment to give a broader picture of their attainment.

The KS2 SATs for English and maths taken since 2016 reflect the amended national curriculum, and are more rigorous than previous years' tests. There is also a new SATs marking scheme and grading system which has replaced national curriculum levels.

In 2020 and 2021 KS2 SATs did not take place due to the Covid-19 pandemic. In 2023, 60% of pupils met the expected standard (a scaled score of 100 out of 120) and 8% achieved a 'higher scaled score' of 110.*
