#### **Travel**

Parents / carers are encouraged to make their own arrangements for their children to travel to and from the venue. However, if this is not possible, we do have limited school transport available to take children from their school to the venue and back again. Please note that transport provided by the school will only be taking back the children that they originally brought at the start of the evening. The only pick up and drop off point for school transport is the child's school.

Children can be dropped off and picked up at the Cranworth Road venue. We do not have the facilities for parents / carers and siblings to remain on site throughout the prom (except in exceptional circumstances). In the case of exceptional circumstances, please contact the school directly in advance.

For children who are being dropped off at the site, please be aware that only street parking will be available. Please pull up or park where it is safe and appropriate to do so and be mindful of the surrounding neighbours. For those with disabilities or mobility issues, please pull up to the gates and we can allow access where appropriate.

If you choose to hire a vehicle to transport your child to and from the venue, please be aware that the drive into the site is not large enough to accommodate limousines.

### **Dress code**

The prom will have a fun, party feel to it. We do not expect any parent / carer or child to go out and buy clothes and shoes especially for the event.

We want children to feel comfortable in what they wear. If they want to wear a dress or a suit, that is fine, as they won't be going outside and the venue is suitable for this. Alternatively, if they want to wear clothes that they would attend a party in, then that is fine as well.

Please do not allow children to carry mobile phones, personal photography will not be allowed inside the building. WPT and school staff will be taking photos on approved devices which will be shared appropriately.

All necessary risk assessments will be in place.
